Athletics

New Athletics eligibility rules: We have been accepted by the MHSAA as an Approved International Student Program (AISP), therefore the athletic eligibility rules for our international students have changed. New international students are able to play their first year of attendance at GRCHS without restrictions, then they are unable to compete during their second year. After their second year they are eligible to compete for the remainder of their time at GRCHS at any level.

Returning students are unable to benefit from this new rule unless they have never competed before in athletics at GRCHS. If you have any questions about this please contact us.

Student Health Insurance You should have received an email with a link to the details for your student's health insurance. They do not provide a physical insurance card so you need to go to the link for the ID card and print that off.

Letter to home family Please be sure to send updates to your student's family back home. This could either be in the form of a monthly letter via email or by smaller WeChat/WhatsApp updates with

photos. If you are hosting a student from China we strongly suggest that you download the WeChat App on your phone. This is the most widely used social media platform in China. We find WeChat to be the most convenient way to communicate with both the students from China and their parents.

House Rules and Family Culture It is very important that you have written down and gone through you house rules/values/expectations and how 'things work' at your home and gone over it with your student. <u>Here</u> is an example of what another host families wrote for their student.
